THE VINEYARD, WINE MAKER AND HISTORY:

Burgundy is famous around the world for its Pinot Noir, but a small part to the south of this region specialises in Chardonnay. The Mâconais is resplendent with rolling limestone hills and, in contrast to the more famous Pinot Noir appellations, it enjoys a long sunny days during summer with the sounds of cicadas breaking through the midday quiet.

Here on the outskirts of the Mācon Villages lies the estate of Château de Nancelle. Established in 1985 and grown on the site of a historic castle, Nathalie and Patrick Corsin have been producing some of the best Mācon whites over the past few years. Like all of our best winemakers, their ideology is minimal interference in the winemaking process letting the beautiful and dramatic terrains of this part of Burgundy come shining through their wines.

The beauty of buying wine from the Mâcon is that it remains a relatively little known white wine region. This means that the wines here do not command an artificially high price and winemakers cannot trade on the reputation of the region as a whole. This Mâcon Villages Chardonnay won the gold medal at the Great Wines of the Mâcon in 2011!

TASTING NOTES:

This is a very refreshing style off Macon produced with 100% Chardonnay. It is unoaked which helps the excellent quality of the grapes that are grown on the Domaine show through. The wine has apple and pear aromas on the nose which follow through onto the medium bodied palate.
